COVID-19: AHA Updates

Soon after the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the American Heart Association (AHA) took steps to capture the impact of coronavirus on patients receiving care for stroke and other cardiovascular conditions. Among these efforts are the AHA COVID-19 quality improvement registry, which tracks cerebrovascular and cardiovascular disease outcomes among hospitalized COVID-19 patients. You can learn
